About Alpacas; are of the camelid family and originate primarily from Peru. These valuable animals have been spreading across the globe over the last 20 years. As their numbers are quite low c. 3.5m globally v 1.3bn sheep, it will be a growth industry for a many years yet. Alpacas have one cria (baby) per annum, their gestation period is 11.5 months and they rarely have twins. The industry will continue to grow due to the qualities of their fibre which exceeds all other domesticated fibre producing animals.

Resilient, Alpacas are found primarily high up in the Andes. They were well adapted for the harshness of this environment and they have adapted easily to the Irish weather environment. They are quite resilient to disease and only require normal parasite & worm dosing, your local vet will advise you here.

Easy on Land, Alpacas have padded feet, unlike most farm animals such as sheep, pigs, cows and horses and are thus very easy on the land. They are efficient grazers, and are very good at converting food. They are not heavy grazers and leave a good cover for meadows to recover quickly.

Easy to keep, Alpacas do not require heavy handling and are quite docile in handling. Alpacas do not challenge fences and a simple post and sheep wire will suffice. Alpacas tend to go to the toilet in the same area thus are easy to keep clean, Alpaca poo is high in nutrients and can be spread directly on flower beds as it won't burn your plants. Add it to your compost heap for rich compost for your vegetables. Alpacas are shorn once a year and produce c. 5kg of fibre. They do require nail clipping twice a year if they are on grass all the time. Over winter they will need some feed supplements.

Movement Documentation.

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded on the document. Sheep from non-restricted flocks only can be moved to Shows. In the case of flocks restricted following diagnosis of scrapie, sheep possessing the ARR/ARR genotype only may be exhibited. The movement of these ARR/ARR genotype sheep must be accompanied by the relevant movement permit (SCR/10), which can be obtained from the local District Veterinary Office in the county where the flock is located.

Flock Register. All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in your flock register.

GENERAL RULES FOR IRISH SHOWS ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS 2018.

A. ELIGIBILITY OF SHOWS

Shows wishing to participate in the 2018 Championships and be eligible to hold qualifiers must have collected the Championship Fund Levy (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle and Sheep class prize money for the year 2017 and forwarded the amount so collected, in full, to the Irish Shows Association Head Office within the stipulated period or not more than **30 days** from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable.

Any show or competitor in breach of the Rules set out below will be disqualified from participating or competing in these championships.

These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating shows and must be strictly observed.

B. QUALIFYING ROUNDS (QUALIFIERS)

Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association.

C. RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOLDING QUALIFYING ROUNDS.

a. Selected shows must hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals will qualify

b. The qualifier class if possible should be held as the **first** (1st) class in the relevant section of the show.

c. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules.

d. No other sponsor may be involved in the qualifying classes. No prize money to be paid.

e. Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class.

The I.S.A. will award a rosette to the successful Qualifiers on appearance at the Final.

f. A show hosting a Championship Final may not hold a qualifier for that Championship on the day of the Final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association. **However** Shows who hold qualifiers for **Horses, Ponies & Cattle** may ask exhibitors to enter the exhibit in **at least one other class** at their show on the day.

g. Animals qualified for Finals are **not** eligible to enter in any other class at the Show where the Final is held **other than a Qualifying Class for another Competition**

h. Shows **should** appoint competent persons to act as stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.

I. Animal Passports & "Micro Chips where applicable" **should** be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.

J. **On completion of judging, Stewards should instruct the successful competitors** to attend at the Show Secretary's Office **within one hour** and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final

K. The show should appoint a well-briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's Office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee.

L. **Show Secretaries must forward completed result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Irish Shows Association within three (3) days following the holding of the show.**

N.B. Shows must return the results card marked "No Competition" for any or all of the events for which no animal (or exhibit) has been selected.

D: **RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS.**

a: **Exhibitors accept that the Judges decision is final in all cases.** Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or cause for complaint arises the matter should only be dealt with under **F.** below

b: **Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals (or exhibits) for the final in accordance with j. and k. above within one hour of qualifying.**

c: Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.

d: The Irish Shows Association in conjunction with the sponsors reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.

e: **Shows and competitors must contact the National Irish Shows Office for details of any championships and not the sponsor involved.**

f: Objections must be lodged in writing with **the Show Secretary** or with the I.S.A. **representative at** the show or the **within half an hour following completion of judging**, together with a fee of 50 euro, or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.

g: Any Exhibitor who makes a false declaration or misrepresents a fact regarding themselves or their exhibit is liable to disqualification and or forfeiture of any prizes awarded

E: **RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOSTING CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS**

a: A deduction of 5% of the prize money is to be collected by the show and forwarded to the Irish Shows Association within 30 days of the final

b: Championship finals must start **not later than 2p.m. on the day of the show** and the advertised time of starting **should** be adhered to as far as practicable. If necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.
