No trading can be carried on within the Show Grounds without written authority from the Secretary, which must be produced on demand.

For the efficient running of the championships all concerned are requested to read and observe the Rules set out below.

GENERAL RULES FOR IRISH SHOWS ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS 2019

A. ELIGIBILITY OF SHOWS

Shows wishing to participate in the 2019 Championships and be eligible to hold qualifiers must have collected the Championship Fund Levy (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle and Sheep class prize money for the year 2018 and forwarded the amount so collected, in full, to the Irish Shows Association Head Office within the stipulated period or not more than **30 days** from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable.

Any show or competitor in breach of the Rules set out below will be disqualified from participating or competing in these championships.

These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating shows and must be strictly observed.

B. QUALIFYING ROUNDS (QUALIFIERS)

Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association.

C. RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOLDING QUALIFYING ROUNDS.

- a. Selected shows must hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals will qualify
- b. The qualifier class if possible should be held as the first (1st) class in the relevant section of the show.
- c. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules.
- d. No other sponsor may be involved in the qualifying classes. No prize money to be paid.

Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class.

The I.S.A. will award a rosette to the successful Qualifiers on appearance at the Final.

- f. A show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifier for that Championship on the day of the Final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association. **However** Shows who hold qualifiers for

Horses, Ponies & Cattle may ask exhibitors to enter the exhibit in **one other class** at their show on the day.

- g. Animals qualified for Finals are **not** eligible to enter in any other class at the Show where the Final is held **other than a Qualifying Class for another Competition**
- h. Shows **should** appoint competent well-briefed stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
- I. Animal Passports & “Micro Chips where applicable” should be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.
- J. **On completion of judging, Stewards must instruct the successful competitors** to attend at the Show Secretary's Office **within one hour** and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final
- K. The show must appoint a well-briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's Office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee.

L. Show Secretaries must forward completed result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Irish Shows Association within three (3) days following the holding of the show.

N.B. Shows must return the results card marked “No Competition” for any or all of the events for which no animal (or exhibit) has been selected.

D. RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS.

- a. **Exhibitors accept that the Judges decision is final in all cases.** Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or cause for complaint arises the matter should only be dealt with under F. below
- b. **Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals (or exhibits) for the final in accordance with j. and k. above within one hour of qualifying.**
- c. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.
- d. The Irish Shows Association in conjunction with the sponsors reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.
- e. **Shows and competitors must contact the National Irish Shows Office for details of any championships and not the sponsor involved.**

- f. Objections must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. **representative at the show or the Show Secretary within half an hour following completion of judging**, together with a fee of 50 euro, or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.
- g. Any Exhibitor who makes a false declaration or misrepresents a fact regarding themselves or their exhibit is liable to disqualification and or forfeiture of any prizes awarded

E. RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOSTING CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

- a. A deduction of 5% of the prize money is to be collected by the show and forwarded to the Irish Shows Association within 30 days of the final
- b. Championship finals must start **not later than 2p.m. on the day of the show** and the advertised time of starting **should** be adhered to as far as practicable. If necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.

NOTICES OF INTEREST TO CHAMPIONSHIP PARTICIPANTS.

IRISH LAW (EU DIRECTIVE)

Under Irish Law all horses moving from one location to another must be accompanied by their passports. It is in your own interest to ensure this is the case. Failure to do so is an offence under Irish Law and is liable on summary conviction to result in a fine up to €3000. All passports must be registered with the name of the current owner.

Embryo Transfer; Where a foal is produced by this method the dam's passport must bear a declaration dated, stamped and signed by the stallion owner (or accredited practitioner where AI is involved) stating the date on which the dam was last covered (or inseminated) and the name of the covering stallion.

Important Notice - Horse-riding is a dangerous sport and all competitors in Ridden Classes are strongly advised, for their own safety, to wear appropriate head gear which complies with up to date safety standards

About Alpacas; are of the camelid family and originate primarily from Peru. These valuable animals have been spreading across the globe over the last 20 years. As their numbers are quite low c. 3.5m globally v 1.3bn sheep, it will be a growth industry for a many years yet. Alpacas have one cria (baby) per annum, their gestation period is 11.5 months and they rarely have twins. The industry will continue to grow due to the qualities of their fibre which exceeds all other domesticated fibre producing animals.

Resilient, Alpacas are found primarily high up in the Andes. They were well adapted for the harshness of this environment and they have adapted easily to the Irish weather environment. They are quite resilient to disease and only require normal parasite & worm dosing, your local vet will advise you here.

Easy on Land, Alpacas have padded feet, unlike most farm animals such as sheep, pigs, cows and horses and are thus very easy on the land. They are efficient grazers, and are very good at converting food. They are not heavy grazers and leave a good cover for meadows to recover quickly.

Easy to keep, Alpacas do not require heavy handling and are quite docile in handling. Alpacas do not challenge fences and a simple post and sheep wire will suffice. Alpacas tend to go to the toilet in the same area thus are easy to keep clean, Alpaca poo is high in nutrients and can be spread directly on flower beds as it won't burn your plants. Add it to your compost heap for rich compost for your vegetables. Alpacas are shorn once a year and produce c. 5kg of fibre. They do require nail clipping twice a year if they are on grass all the time. Over winter they will need some feed supplements.

General Conditions & Regulations

General

1. The Committee reserves to itself the sole and absolute right to interpret these or other prescribed conditions and regulations, and to settle or determine all or any matters, questions or difference in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show; and to refuse or cancel any entries, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, vary or cancel awards of prizes, amalgamate or change order of classes, and relax or vary conditions as the Committee shall deem expedient. The decision of the Committee shall be final in all respects.
2. The Committee shall appoint as many Stewards as they consider necessary to assist at the Show, and all such Stewards shall have full power to enforce all the Rules and Regulations thereof.
3. Neither the Society or any of its officers or servants shall be in any way responsible or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to Exhibitors or their servants, or to any exhibit or property brought into the Show Yard, or for anything else in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to the Society's Show. Each Exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him, and for its description as given in the Catalogue, and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings thereto. The Society will endeavour to have the Catalogue as complete as possible in accordance with the particulars submitted.

Entries & Prizes

4. All animals must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry.
5. All entries must be on the Society's printed Forms, which may be had on application to the Secretary, and these must be lodged with her, properly filled up, accompanied by entry fees, on or before the last day that may be fixed for entries otherwise the entry may be rejected.
6. Any mis-statement in the Form of Entry, or attempt at deception, will subject the exhibitor to disqualification for all Prizes which may be awarded to him. A declaration may be required of the accuracy or any statement in a Form of Entry.
7. All animals for competition must be in the Show Yard at least 30 mins. Before stated starting time of its class to enable judging to start without delay.
8. The decision of the Judges shall in all cases be final. The Judges are empowered to withhold prizes where they deem there is insufficient merit.
9. In each Section the number of prizes awarded will depend upon the number of entries in each Class. If there are less than three entries, the Class will be cancelled. No second prize will be awarded unless there are four entries in the Class and no third prize will be awarded unless there are five entries in the Class. However Rosettes may be given.
10. The Prizes will be denoted as coloured rosettes attached to the winners. First Prize, Red; Second Prize, Blue; Third Prize, Yellow; Fourth Prize, Green; Reserve,

Purple; Highly Commended, Commended, White; Championship or Special Prizes, Red, White & Blue, Reserve for Special Prize, Red, White, Red.

11. Owners of exhibits are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, exhibitor, groom, rider or herdsman will disqualify any animal for adjudication or for taking a Prize, and the owner shall forfeit his Entry Fee. The Committee reserves the power to remove any owner, groom or other person, or any animal from their grounds without being liable for compensation.
12. No person shall be allowed to enter a Ring where judging is taking place except the Society's Officials in the course of their duties and persons leading or riding the animals being exhibited. Infringement of this rule may result in disqualification.
13. No Steward or other officer of the Society shall remain in the Judging Ring acting as Steward while a Class is being judged in which he is an exhibitor, or in which there is any animal exhibited in which directly or indirectly, he is interested. A breach of this Rule will entail forfeiture of any prize or commendation which may be awarded to his exhibit.
14. A Veterinary Surgeon shall not examine the animals exhibited in any Class where he owns or has any interest directly or indirectly in an animal exhibited therein.
15. No refund of entry fees will be made in the case of entries which are not sent forward for completion or which are disqualified for failure to comply with the regulations.

Horses & Ponies

16. The ages of horses and ponies shall count from the 1st January of the year of birth, except in the case of yearlings, where the actual date of birth must be given.
17. All four-year-olds and upwards must be ridden with bridle and saddle, and horses under that age must be led with proper bridles or cavessons, excepting Brood Mare & Potential Brood Mare classes.
18. A prize by a Brood Mare without a foal at foot will be withheld until the Committee is satisfied that the Mare was in foal at time of entry.
19. All animals, except Stallions, registered for present year by the Dept. of Agriculture; Yearlings and Ponies and Jumping Horses, shall be subject to the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon. Stallions shall not be disqualified by accidental blemishes or injuries.
20. (a) In certain Classes, as may be decided by the Committee from time to time, animals will be examined in the Ring by one of the Veterinary Surgeons appointed by the Society. If the Veterinary Surgeon considers an animal unsound, it will be considered as such and there will be no appeal against this decision. Should the two Veterinary Surgeons be unable to agree on any examination, the Society empowers them to call in a third Veterinary Surgeon to act as Referee, in this case the decision of the Referee will be final.
(b) For any Veterinary examination other than those for the Classes scheduled under Rule 20(a) above, including measuring of horses, hacks and ponies, each animal shall be examined by only one Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Society, but if the owner lodges an objection in writing with the Secretary within half an hour after the award has been made, together with €50, the horse

shall then be examined by two other Veterinary Surgeons appointed by the Society, and the decision of the majority of such three Veterinary Surgeons shall be final and binding, and if the decision be over-ruled by such majority the owner who objected shall forfeit the €50 fee, and same shall thereupon become the exclusive property of the Society.

21. In classes where measuring is required, all animals shall be measured as directed by the stewards
22. Previous to the Show a number will be available for each Exhibitor. This number will correspond with the number in the Catalogue and must be on display.
